# **Cesaris went to Herford**

### **Comenius new workshop: cooking!**

**Herford.** A new exciting adventure for students of the Comenius project was held in Herford, in the cold Germany. The guys, who left last 9<sup>th</sup> of March, had the opportunity to attend a photography lesson held by a well known local photographer. Students were welcomed by German host families and with them they spent 5 days the Deutsch-style (sleeping in typical German houses and, above all, eating German food). On the first day the Italians spent a lazy day with their hosts. The second was very lively for all the participants: we visited the Museum of Essen which is 2 hours from Herford by bus. There, early in the morning, the group was accompanied by a guide to visit the various areas of the structure, which also provided historical information on the mine, on its owners and workers. After lunch (sausages and curry in the mine's canteen), the students and their teachers visited the Museum of Works and German history. The next morning the company attended a photography lesson, after which students had been experimenting new techniques for some time. Later all the students took part in a treasure hunt throughout the building, during which they had the opportunity to visit the Wilhelm Normann Kolleg and explain their works. In the afternoon groups of 4 to 6 students were formed, and each of them was given the task of cooking a traditional German dinner. Then, armed with cameras and ready to document the cooking workshop, they went to the supermarket to buy what they needed for dinner. Once at home, the new "Master Chefs" cooked and ate with their cameras flashing around. The next morning, the results of the dinner were shown through a PowerPoint presentation. The Group was accompanied by an Art teacher to visit the town of Herford, with a final stop at the municipality where they were welcomed by the President of the Province, who had a conversation with the Italian and French students about their places of origin. After lunch at the City Hall, the group disbanded and everyone prepared for the last evening in Germany. The next morning, at Herford, the guys were greeted and the Italian group left for Düsseldorf, where they had the opportunity to visit the city centre before taking the plane to Italy. An exciting learning experience, which helped to broaden our horizons and to watch the world from a different perspective.

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
